
Library Trustee Candidate Information

The Smithtown Library Board of Trustees will have four (4) seats, of a seven seat Board, up for election this year. Two seats will possess the standard three-year term commencing on January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2026. The remaining two seats are currently being served by interim appointees due to the resignations of previously elected Trustees. Therefore, the candidates who are elected to these two seats will serve the remainder of the terms - October 11, 2023 through December 31, 2024.

Per the statute that governs the Smithtown Special Library District, no vacancy on the Board is considered to be a separate specific office. Therefore, the number of votes a candidate garners will determine the length of his/her term. The highest two receivers of votes will serve the standard 3-year terms. The 3rd and 4th highest receivers of votes will serve from October 11, 2023 through December 31, 2024.

Los dos puestos restantes actualmente están siendo ocupados por personas designadas interinamente debido a las renuncias de los Fideicomisarios elegidos previamente.
