


The Death of Vivek Oji by Akwaeke Emezi


Detransition, Baby by Torrey Peters

A trans woman, her detransitioned ex, and his cisgender lover build an unconventional family together in the wake of heartbreak and an unplanned pregnancy.




The House in the Cerulean Sea by TJ Klune
