Eclipse Craze Spreads to The Smithtown Library


On April 8, our community was able to look up and catch a phenomenon in the sky. New Yorkers were able to witness a solar eclipse at 3:26pm, when 89.4% of the sun was covered by the moon! The Library was thrilled to have shared over 1,700 pairs of solar eclipse glasses with our community!

After the eclipse, we were a drop off point to recycle solar eclipse glasses. All glasses were donated to **Warby Parker** in the Smith Haven Mall who then donated them to **Astronomers Without Borders**.

A Letter from the Friends of The Smithtown Library

The cold weather is gone and the budding of flowers and trees usher us into summer time. While this means all the chores that come with the new season will be back, when you get tired and want a break, think library! You can browse among the books and other materials or come to one of the many programs offered at all of the buildings.

The Friends raise money throughout the year from book sales, raffles, donations and more. Because of this, we are able to help fund those areas that fall outside of the Library's operating budget. One of the most popular programs that the Friends support is the Museum Pass Program which we were able to fully support for 2024 at a cost of \$10,895. Please contact the Children's Department at the Smithtown Building for more information or to reserve a pass. In addition to the Museum Pass Program, the Friends once again offered scholarships to two seniors this past year, in the amounts of \$1,500 and \$750, respectively. This year the Friends were able to support two new projects in conjunction with the Library. The first was the addition of the Outdoor Classroom at the Commack Building at a cost of \$15,000, which was fully funded by the Friends. We also helped to defray part of the cost of the Library's new website by \$15,000 that was launched last April. In 2023, we were also able to raise \$3,080 from raffle baskets that we had throughout the year at each building.

It is time to renew your membership with the Friends of The Smithtown Library. Lifetime members will have their names inscribed on a plate added to the recognition board in the Smithtown Building. All new members that join will receive a postcard in the mail which you can turn in at the Circulation Desk at any of the Library's four buildings to receive a Friends of The Smithtown Library magnet.

We are always looking for new Friends and urge you to give us a chance so come join us at one of our monthly meetings which begin promptly at 7:00pm. Participating in the Friends is a wonderful way of giving back to the community. I try to keep the meetings short, but interesting! Your continued support of the Friends is greatly appreciated and we hope to see you at our next meeting.
